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(ENRL-001) RESIDENT STUDENTS EDUCATED ELSEWHERE

FUNCTION AND PURPOSE

All traditional districts receive a Resident Students Educated Elsewhere Report, which is a Level 2 report that can be found in the Data collector. Rows on the Resident Students Educated Elsewhere Report are generated when a student is reported as being educated at a different LEA than the student’s resident district. At this time, only certain categories of resident students being educated at another LEA are included on the report. Additional categories of students may be added in the future. On each row, a flag is displayed indicating whether the student was reported with a disability condition.

If this report explanation—in concert with the EMIS Manual—does not answer your questions or help you to resolve your issues with this report, then the normal path to getting help with EMIS reporting should be followed. The first point of contact should be the EMIS coordinator, followed by the Information Technology Center (who will contact the EMIS helpdesk when necessary), and finally ODE EMIS directly.

The sections below list the data that appears on this report, the data calculated for this report, and information regarding the processing of the report.

PROCESS DESCRIPTION

This report will include the following categories of students who are educated at an LEA that is not their resident district. The resident district is determined based on the Legal District of Residence IRN reported by the educating LEA. Each category of students will be assigned a different result code.

- Students open enrolled in another traditional district
- Students open enrolled in another district and attending a JVSD
- Students open enrolled in a JVSD that is not in the resident district’s jointure
- Students enrolled in a community school
- Students enrolled in a STEM district

Layout and Fields

The Resident Students Educated Elsewhere Report is a Level 2 Report in the data collector. As with other Level 2 reports, it is possible to view the entire report or portions of the report by Severity Code. The name of the report is (ENRL-001) Resident Students Educated Elsewhere.

LEA IRN. The IRN of the resident district. This is the IRN of the district receiving the report.

LEVEL 2 REC TYPE CODE. This is the name of the report. Each row on the report will have “ENRL-001” displayed in this column.

SSID (State Student ID). The state assigned identification code.

REPORTING IRN. The IRN of the LEA where the student is being educated.

FTE_START_DATE. The FTE start date as displayed on the educating LEA’s FTE Detail Report.

FTE_END_DATE. The FTE end date as displayed on the educating LEA’s FTE Detail Report.

ADJSTD FTE. The adjusted FTE as displayed on the educating LEA’s FTE Detail Report.

RESULT CODE, RESULT DESCR (Result Code and Description).

Code	Description
EN0001	Open enrolled in another traditional district
EN0002	Open enrolled in another traditional district and attending JVSD
EN0003	Open enrolled into a non-jointure JVSD
EN0004	Enrolled in a community school
EN0005	Enrolled in a STEM district
EN0006	Resident student enrolled in the Autism Scholarship Program
EN0007	Resident student enrolled in the Jon Peterson Scholarship program

SEVERITY CODE. Each row on the Report will be assigned Severity Code ‘I’ (Informational).

STUDENT WITH DISABILITY FLAG. A Y/N flag will be placed on each row to indicate a student’s disability status.
