# Our why

**Writing instruction is important, but**

- (30) It is hard to teach.
- (15) I don't have time to teach it.
- (15) Students are at different levels.

## Timekeeper

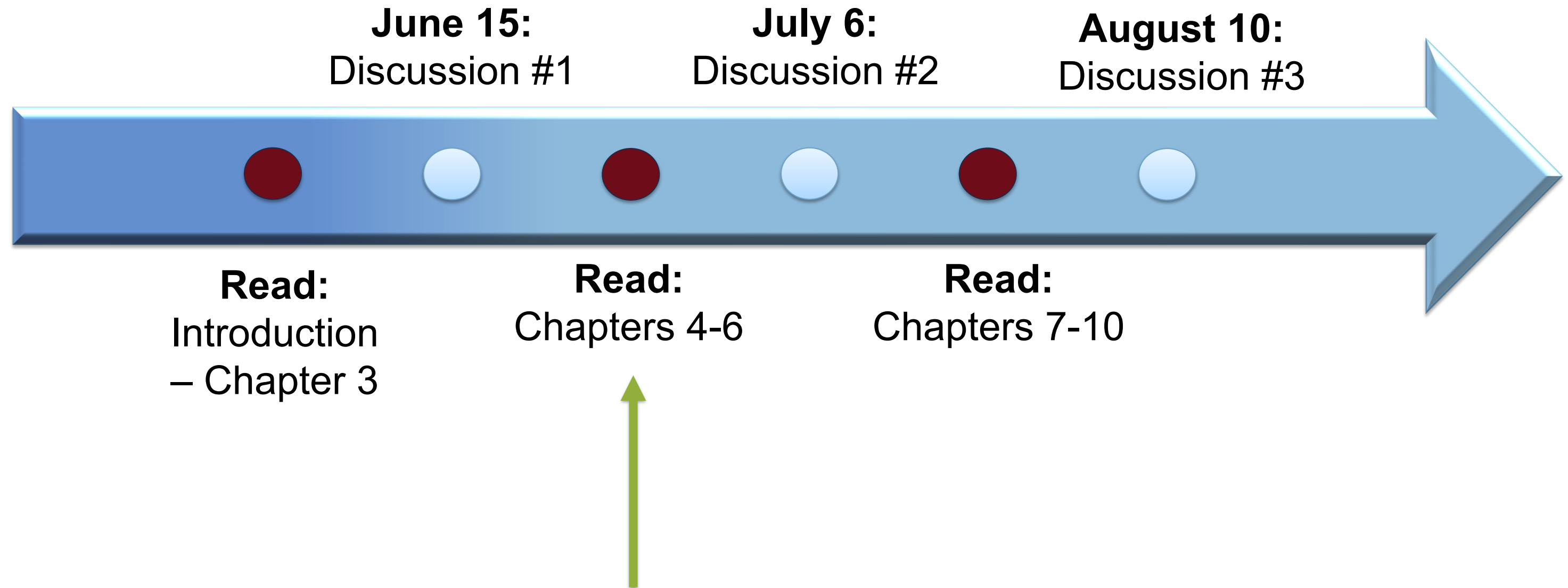

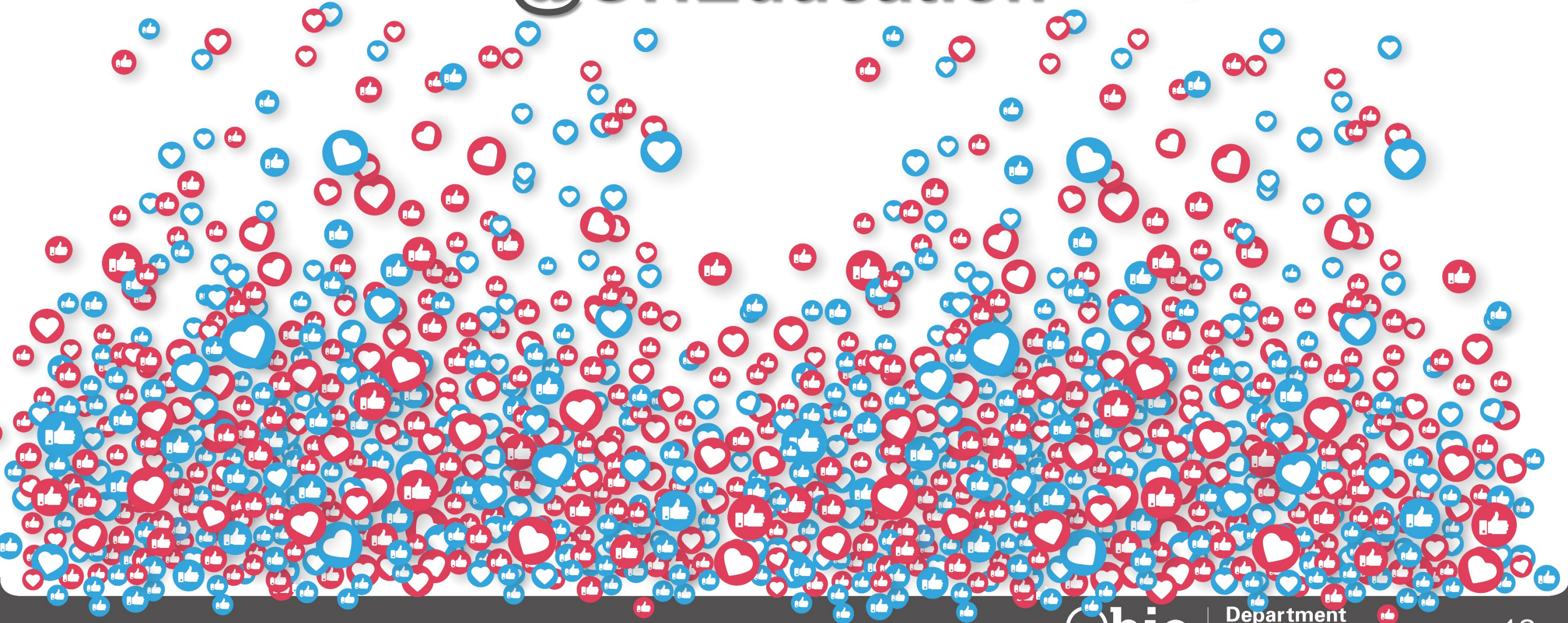
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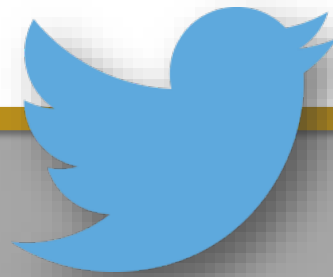
