	Students earn points toward graduation on seven end-of-course exams. These exams will replace the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT). The Individualized Education	
	Program (IEP) team may exempt a student with disabilities from consequences of	
	not being proficient on end-of-course tests. When the IEP team determines a	
	student is exempt from being proficient on an end-of-course test, the student may	
	receive three points (equivalent to proficient) for each exempted test required for	
	graduation. There is no alternate test for end-of-course tests.	
	Some students may be eligible to participate in an alternate assessment per the	
	Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities	
	participation guidelines. For these students, a proficient score in each of the	
	content areas – English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies –	
	may replace the graduation requirement of a minimum composite score on the seven end-of-course tests.	
Emerging Issues/Unmet Needs	Administrative Complaint was filed with the Department of Justice by Disability	
	Rights Ohio (DRO) and Advocates for Basic Legal Equality (ABLE) against several	
	school districts and the Ohio Department of Education around limited English	
	proficient families and students with and without disabilities.	
	Laryssa Beatty shared several concerns:	
	 State Support Teams – The region in the Southeast area of the state covers 	
	a large geographical area. Is there any talk about splitting it? She shared	
	that she spoke to a principal who indicated services were not being	
	received from the SST due to distance.	
	• The regions of the SSTs are legislated and would require legislative	
	changes to adjust the regional geographic boundaries.	

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	 Suspension and expulsion rates – Is there a rule around functional behavior assessments (FBAs)? FBA's are required under federal law when a child's placement has been changed ude to disciplinary removal. Laryssa Beatty was encouraged to formally submit the issues as an unmet need in order to begin formal consideration by the SAPEC Executive Committee if she believes they are an unmet need in the state. 	
Agency Reports	 Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities: Student being bullied in public school and family decided to remove student from public school and enrolled the student in a developmental disabilities school. There is a need to work with the principal at the school to improve the climate at the school and address bullying concerns. There is a lot of discussion on sheltered workshops closing but that is not necessarily accurate. The agency is working to build local capacity to transition students out of sheltered workshops when possible through the Employement First Initiative. To build community capacity and give options for employment. Changes are occurring across the state and more clarity will come with time. 	
	 Ohio Association of County Boards of Developmental Disabilities (OACBDD): At the last OACBDD Superintendent's meeting, Dr. Zake and staff provided an update to Superintendents on several topics including class size and age range waivers, calamity days/hours and graduation options. County Boards of Developmental Disabilities are following closely the discussions at the state and federal level regarding the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) transition plan that is due from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities to CMS by March 17, 2015. There is also much discussion about the CMS interpretation of "Conflict Free Case Management" and how this will impact services provided by County Boards of Developmental Disabilities. 	
	 Ohio Department of Education (ODE): ODE is planning to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Education to extend it's Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) flexilibity waiver and is currently accepting feedback and comments. Members will be sent an email with a link to the information. 	

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	 McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Program application is open in the Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Plan (CCIP). The purpose of McKinney-Vento subgrants is to facilitate the enrollment, attendance and success in school of homeless children and youth. The deadline to apply is 5 p.m. on April 24, 2015. Applications must be submitted in the CCIP.
